Course Description:

This course is designed to provide you with the full experience of searching for an internship. You will be provided with information that will assist your success personally, academically and professionally. Themes include the importance of targeting your resume and cover letter to internship postings, communicating interests and skills to potential employers, searching for internships, networking with alumni and professionals in your intended career field and more. The expectations for this course parallel those expected at an internship/job, so the instructor will assess student work and behaviors by the same standards as employers expect of their interns/employees.

Due to the independent nature of an online course, students are responsible for staying on pace with the course lectures and activities. You can expect to spend **at least** 1½-2 hours per module on course content and activities.

Course Objectives:

As an active participant in this class, you will be able to:

- Identify and understand how your unique characteristics, skills, and interests align with employment industries and possible internship opportunities.
- Demonstrate a solid grasp on online tools and resources relevant to your career interests and internship search.
- Learn the purpose of a resume and cover letter and how to tailor each document to the internship job description.
- Become familiar with internship search strategies utilized by different career fields and understand the skills and qualities employers seek in potential candidates.
- Understand how to network and connect effectively with professionals in your career field(s) of interest.
- Learn what to expect during the interview process and how to make the most of your internship experience.

Asynchronous Course with Three (3) Live Interactions

Though the majority of this course is asynchronous on ELMS, students will have three (3) live interactions in the course. - 3. **A virtual mock interview.** Students will sign up for a time-slot in Module 04 and the mock interview will take place sometime on either Monday, May 2 or Tuesday, May 3, 2022 from 12pm-4pm.
